- ◆ *Family or friends are concerned about gambling activities.*
- ◆ *Can't stop gambling.*



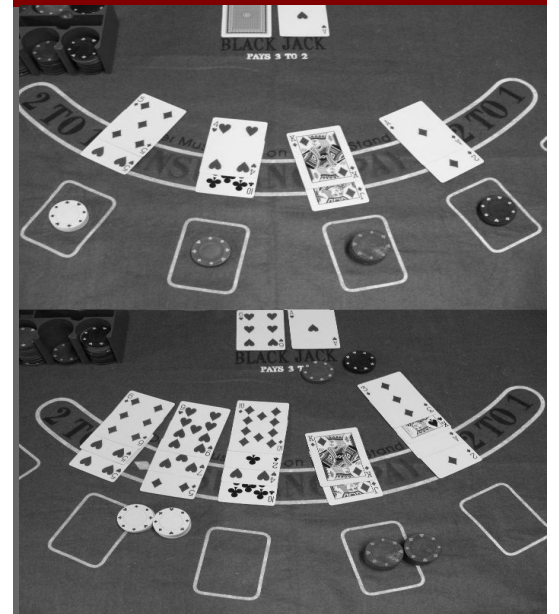

Problem Gambling Quick Facts

- ◆ In California, approximately 922,000 adult and 596,700 youth are problem gamblers.
- ◆ The estimated cost of adult problem gamblers in California is \$998, 000,000.
- ◆ 75% of youth report having gambled.
- ◆ San Diego has more Indian casinos than any other county in the state with six (6) new or expanded casinos in the planning stage.



Problem Gamblers are more likely than non-gamblers to have ever been -

- ◆ Divorced
- ◆ Dependent on alcohol or drugs
- ◆ Arrested
- ◆ Declared bankrupt

Most people who gamble are not problem or pathological gamblers, but for those who are —life can take unexpected difficult turns for them...and their loved ones. While many people would like to help those in need, it is difficult to do so without the proper information and skills.
